Growing Seasons: Summer

CHARACTER AND SETTING SORT (SWEET POTATO)

MATERIALS:

- Little Sweet Potato by Amy Beth Bloom
- Character and Setting Sort Worksheet (provided)
- Child safe scissors
- Glue sticks or tape

SUMMARY:

In the book, *Little Sweet Potato*, the little sweet potato learns that it is important to be kind and respectful. Part of being kind and respectful is accepting others for who they are instead of what they look like.



ACTIVITY:

- 1. Read, Little Sweet Potato, by Amy Beth Bloom.
- 2. Discuss the story as a class. Explain what the terms 'character' and 'setting' mean and give students examples of each from the story. For example, the sweet potato and each of the vegetables that he runs into are examples of characters from the story, while the flower patch and the road are examples of settings.
- 3. Once students have an understanding of the different terms, have them complete the provided "Character and Setting Sort" worksheet.
- 4. After students have completed sorting, explain what the term 'event' means as it pertains to literature. As a class, discuss any major events that occurred in the story.
- 5. Wrap the activity up by heading out to your garden and checking on your sweet potatoes! Don't forget to water, weed and mulch if needed.
