Book Recommendations: *The Honey Bee* by Kristen Hall, Illustrated by Isabelle Arsenault

BE AND BEE AND DANCE (ZINNIAS)

MATERIALS:

• The Honey Bee by Kristen Hall

Optional - honey sticks, bee stickers, or veggies from the garden to use as prizes (enough for each student)

SUMMARY:

In the book, *The Honey Bee* by Kristen Hall, we learn that bees use dancing as a way to show other bees where they can find flowers. Can you pretend to be a honey bee and make up your own dance?



- 1. After reading the book, *The Honey Bee by Kristen Hall*, review with students how honey bees use dancing to show other honey bees where to find flowers.
- 2.As a class, go out to your garden or another outside area where students have enough room to spread out and dance.
- Before spreading out, explain to students that the class will be creating their own dance. Brainstorm different dance moves as a class. Let students volunteer to share their ideas and demonstrate their move for the class.
 Instruct students to spread out so that they have enough room to move and dance.
- 4. Instruct students to spread out so that they have enough room to move and dance.
- 5. Tell students that you'll be selecting students to be the 'leader' of the dance. Each student will get a chance to be the leader and when it's their turn to lead, they'll do a dance move, stop, point at the class, and let the class mimic their dance move. Demonstrate being the leader for the class. For example, put your arms in the air and wiggle them around. Then, point to the class to signal to them to put their arms in the air and wiggle them around.
- 6. After each student has a chance to be the leader, come back together as a class and celebrate your dancing with a honey stick, bee sticker, or veggie snack from your garden!
