

KCCG's Perennial Native Pollinator Plant Guide

These four perennial native pollinator plants that KCCG offers are excellent additions to your garden that attract butterflies, bees, hummingbirds, and more! It's best to plant them between March-May and then again in September.



Clustered Mountain Mint, Pynanthemum muticum Tops leaves turn dusty white followed by formation of small whitish pink nectar rich flowers. A pollinator traffic jam! Flowers from July-early September. Height is 30-36" tall and spreading, but manageable.



Blue Wild Indigo, Baptisia australisFlowers deep blue in May-June. Mature plants can be 4' tall and wide. Ornamental seed pods.



Black-eyed Susan, Rudbeckia fulgidaShowy orange blooms last from July-August.
Attracts may butterflies and other pollinators.
18"-2' tall.



Showy Beardtongue, Penstemon digitalisPlants send up whitish pink flower spikes to 30" in May-June. Bumble bees and hummingbirds regularly visit flowers.
